

2023 FIRST LADY'S COMMEMORATIVE EGGS EXHIBIT

THE 'UNITED STATES OF POSSIBILITY' FEATURES STUDENT DESIGNED EGGS

As part of a nearly five-decade long tradition of presenting a Commemorative Egg to the First Lady, the American Egg Board, on behalf of America's egg farmers, curated a special series of Easter eggs designed by students from all 56 states and territories. Themed 'The United States of Possibility', selected student designs were brought to life on real hen eggs by talented artists specializing in egg artistry.

The First Lady's Commemorative Eggs exhibit will be on display along the White House East Colonnade in April. This special exhibit represents the possibilities and optimism of the next generation.

QUICK FACTS

- Designs were submitted by students of all ages affiliated with their local 4H Club, Boys and Girls Clubs of America, or the USO.
- One design was selected from each state, the District of Columbia and all U.S. Territories for a total of 56 student-designed eggs.
- Designs represent the unique beauty of students' local communities and reflect the theme 'The United States of Possibility'.
- Talented artists from across the country brought to life each student's creative vision on a real hen egg. The artistic process began by hollowing out the egg then cleaning it prior to the artist starting design work.
- The artists use various mediums and techniques, from painted or pysanky methods to dioramas, etched or carved eggs.
